But, today we are going to talk about a very important subject. It's called **safety**. The people who love you most; your parents, grandparents and caretakers want you to always be safe at school. All of us here at school want you to be safe too. So, it's important that you know what to do in case there is ever a time when we need to be **EXTRA SAFE** at school.

We have codes that guide us on how to be safe in case of emergencies. For example, a code green means bad weather is near and we have to move to a safe place and a safe position.

Sometimes there might be an unsafe situation or an event happening on our campus and we have to act fast. We are going to call this a **code red II**.

Can you say code red II? Can you act fast?

Ok!

We might never have a real code red II, but if the announcements ever tell us that we are under a code red II, you will need to listen to your teachers carefully!

We are going to do what's called a safety practice code red II lockdown drill to help show you what we all should do to be safe."

You will hear over the intercom system that the school is in a code red II practice drill at this time. Something like this will be read:

"May I have your attention please? At this time we are now conducting our code red II practice lockdown drill. Again, I repeat this is only a practice drill."
